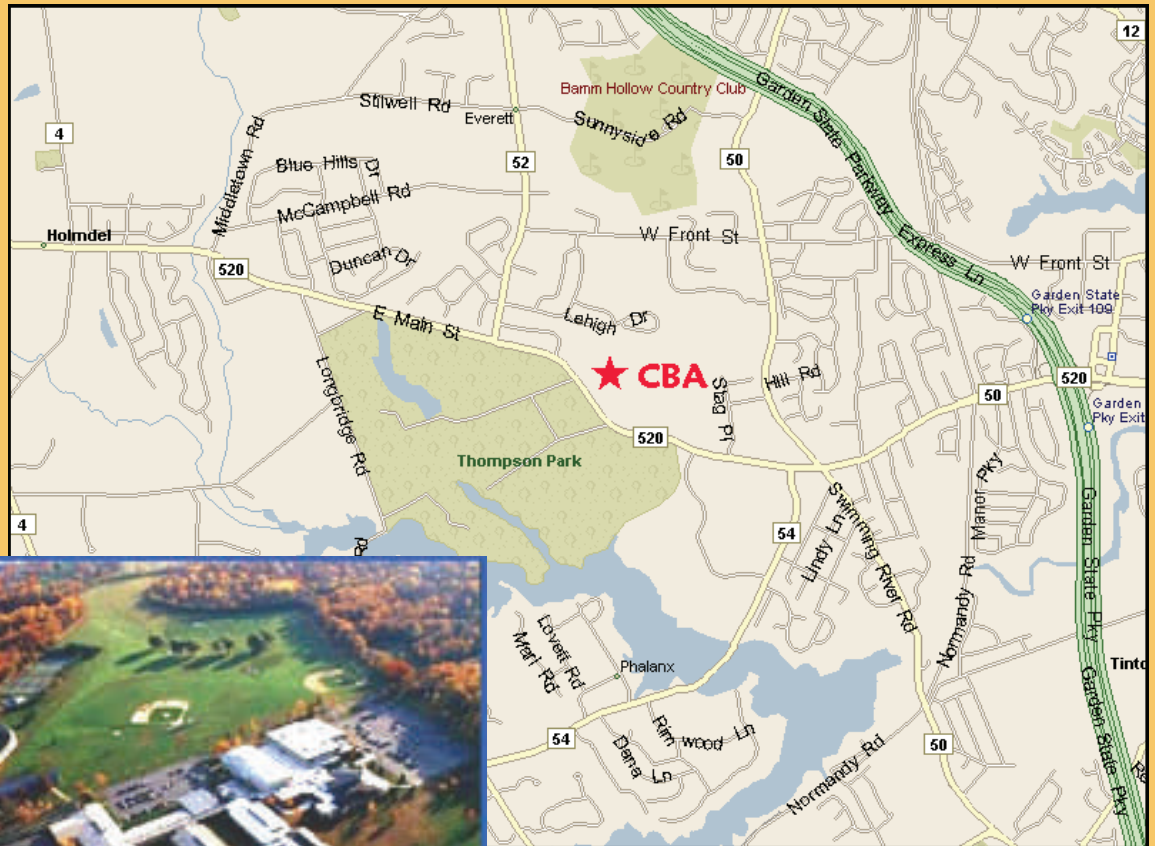

#### **Driving Directions**

CBA is located on Newman Springs Road (Monmouth CR 520) approximately 2.5 miles west of Exit 109 from the Garden State Parkway. (GPS 40.33659 N, 74.14095 W)

**From the North:** GSP South to Exit 109 (pay exit toll). Turn right onto Newman Springs Road heading west. CBA will be about 2.5 miles ahead on your right.

**Alternately,** From the North: GSP South to Exit 114 (no exit toll). Turn right onto Red Hill Road heading west. About .5 mile further, go left onto Crawfords Corner Road. Stay on this road until it ends, about 2 miles along. Turn left on to Newman Springs Road heading east. CBA is about a half-mile ahead on your left.

**From the South:** GSP North to Exit 109 (no exit toll). Keep toward the left on the exit

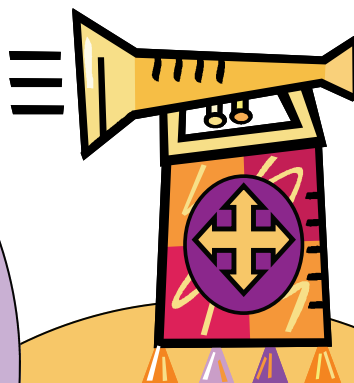
## Purpose Statement

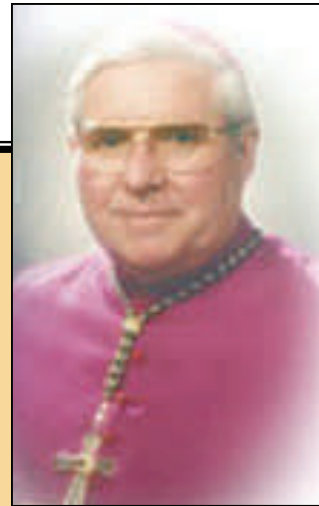

## Proclaiming Christ to All

As Bishop Smith has said, "This is our time to be church!" In today's fast-paced and rapidly changing society, how do we know that our message of the love of Jesus is not falling on deaf ears? Bishop Smith will share with us his journey of faith.



### **Most Reverend John M. Smith**

Bishop John M. Smith, Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton, was born in 1935 in Orange, New Jersey. After studies at Immaculate Conception Seminary, Darlington, he was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Newark on May 27, 1961.

In 1966, he received a doctorate in canon law from the Catholic University of America. Bishop Smith served the Archdiocese of Newark in various capacities as parish priest, seminary professor, assistant chancellor, and coordinator for the Cursillo movement. From 1982 to 1986, Bishop Smith was the Director of the Institute for Continuing Theological Education at the North American College in Rome.

Returning to Newark in 1986 he was appointed Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia. On December 1, 1987, Pope John Paul II named him an Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, and he was ordained a bishop on January 25, 1988. Bishop Smith served as Bishop of Pensacola-Tallahassee, Florida, from 1991 to 1995.

On November 25, 1995, Pope John Paul II named Bishop Smith to be Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton. On July 1, 1997, he became the Bishop of Trenton, succeeding the retiring Bishop John C. Reiss.

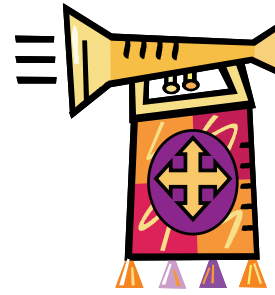

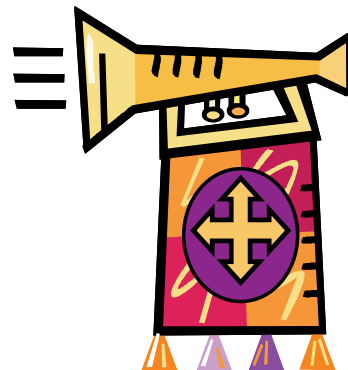
